Lerner and music by Frederick Loewe for their 1951 Broadway musical, *Paint Your Wagon*, which is set in the California Gold Rush. The song gained renewed popularity during the American folk music revival. In 1959, it was included on the Kingston Trio's first live album, *from the Hungry i*, which reached #2 on the Billboard Pop chart and won a RIAA gold record in 1960. It was also included on the Smothers Brothers first album, *The Songs and Comedy of the Smothers Brothers*, recorded at the Purple Onion, San Francisco, released in 1961.
