"Moments to Remember" was recorded by Canadian quartet The Four Lads in 1955. It was written by Robert Allen and Al Stillman originally for Perry Como, but was turned down by Como's management. It eventually reached number 2 on Billboard magazine's Top 100 hit list, sold 4 million copies and became The Four Lads' first gold record. Bing Crosby recorded the song on November 23, 1955 with Buddy Cole and His Orchestra. Louis Armstrong - a single release (1955). Ray Conniff recorded an instrumental version in 1960 for his Columbia album Memories Are Made of This.
